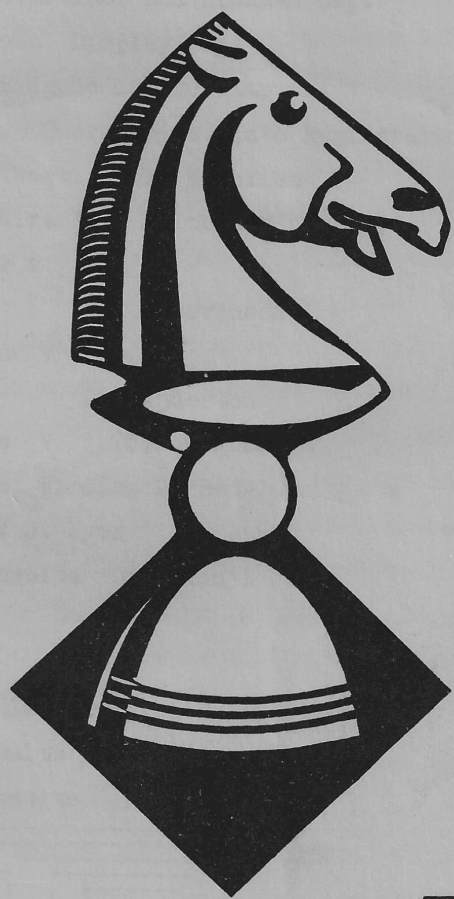

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PREMIER AT HASTINGS 1966.

This Tournament started with a favourite Boris Spassky, who has secured a place in the final for the Worlds Chess Championship which is due to start on April 11th 1966.

As in any other important event there are always surprises and one will agree that the young Enfield player W.Hartson provided an excellent example in the 1966 Hastings Premier by beating the eminent Yugoslav Grandmaster S.Gligoric. The remarkable thing was that Hartson had more knowledge about this particular variation in the Sicilian than his opponent, and so Gligoric came to disaster in 25 moves.

The present British Champion P.Lee never really got going it seemed that the opposition this time was far too strong. N.Littlewood played far too erratic and was not able to provide the thrills and combinations that he used to. I am positive if Littlewood would take more precautions and avoid rush decisions he would achieve more favourable results.

B.Spassky and Uhlmann shared first & second prize with  $7\frac{1}{2}$  points each.

### CHALLENGERS AT HASTINGS.

This Tournament proved to be most interesting and attracted a great deal of attention. There were 36 competitors and a good many from overseas. The Midlands were represented by P.C. Gibbs (Sutton Col) D.G. Leven (Loughborough) and our own D.W. Anderton. The latter did not achieve peak form and in my opinion did not do justice to his chess ability by only finishing 32nd.

The celebrity of the tourney was young David Keene from Dulwich who drew his last game with Y. Balashev U.S.S.R. with whom he shared first and second prize. The tie splitting places Balashev came officially first, this securing the coveted place in next years Premier.

### NEW YEAR'S 'A' TOURNAMENT .

M.A. Stevenson from W-ton Kipping provided us with some consolation at Hastings. He was a joint winner of the above Tournament by scoring 4 out of 5 points winning 3 drawing 2.

In the final round he beat J.D. Taylor from London in 19 moves. One of his games are printed in the games section.

On behalf of W-ton and District Chess League we extend our congratulations to M.A. Stevenson. for his splendid performance.



HAPPY BIRTHDAY.

The Estonian Grandmaster Paul Keres one of the Worlds best chessplayer celebrated his 50th Birthday early in January.

Keres started to dominate the chess World in the middle 30s. In three years he had become a candidate for the Worlds title. During 1938 he won the right to a title match against worlds champion A. Alekhine after winning a Tournament of eight outstanding players. The war prevented the holding of this important match. In 1947 Keres returned to fame by winning the U.S.S.R. championship, and won at Hastings, the same year he won at Los Angeles and Beverweiji. Further more Keres is the only Soviet Grandmaster who has taken part in all World chess team championship.

Keres has carried out fundamental chess research, and some of his works are considered to be classics. Three parts of his 'School Chess' became guide books on opening theory and has been translated in number of foreign languages. Paul Keres has invariably been one of the contestants in the world title challengers match and has come second in these battles on four occasions.

The Estonian Grandmaster is a true chess genius who retains his old militant spirit and ability to fathom out complicated situations at all times.

His final analysis was as follows;

Won 10, Drew 11, Lost 3. Average 64.585 %

I would not describe this as an outstanding success for the Grandmaster. Although one must take into consideration the arduous week's chess at Hastings prior to this engagement.

My own opinion is that he was asked to cover too much ground between last and first board thus permitting his opponents excessive time to analyse their positions.

However the evening was a happy one and enjoyed by all present. We look forward to meeting the Grandmaster again in the meantime we wish him every success.
